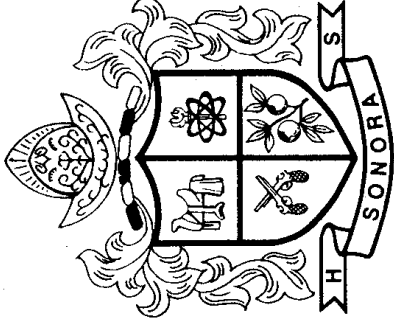


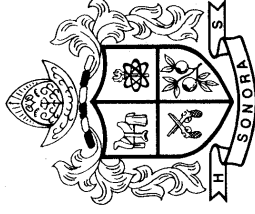

## PURPOSE OF THE HANDBOOK

This handbook familiarizes students and their parents with Sonora High School and answers the most commonly asked questions about the school’s programs, policies, and activities. In addition, it contains suggestions to parents and to students about study habits as well as a school calendar, a school telephone directory. We encourage you to take the time to read through this handbook in order to help make the high school experience a successful one.

## HONORS PROGRAMS

Sonora High School maintains comprehensive honors programs for the academically talented student. These programs are committed to academic excellence to ensure preparation for college coursework. Qualified students may select from these honors options - International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement.

## STUDENT DRESS AND GROOMING

Your first and most important job is to be a successful student at Sonora High School. Part of this success includes following school guidelines, including those regarding appropriate school dress. Clothing should be neat, clean, and appropriate for school. Students are prohibited from wearing any attire or being groomed in a manner that, in the judgement of the principal/designee, is disruptive to the instructional process.

1. Hats, baseball-type caps, or other headgear such as bandannas, visors or hair nets worn on campus or at school activities are to be school-affiliated, medically/religiously approved, or approved by the principal/designee. Shirts and sweatshirts with hoods are permitted, but the hood must be off the head while in the school buildings.
2. Spiked collars, spiked wristbands, chains (including wallet chains), belts or other clothing, jewelry, or accessories which could pose a threat to student physical well being and safety are not permitted.
3. Shoes must be worn at all times. Steel toe shoes are not permitted.
4. Garments must be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times.
  - a. No revealing shorts, dresses, or skirts.
  - b. A minimal amount of skin should be showing while student is standing normally.
  - c. No halter-tops, tube tops, or backless tops may be worn.

- d. No see-through or revealing tops may be worn.
- e. Shoulder straps on tops should be at least 2 inches wide.
5. Offensive, crude or vulgar printing or pictures relating to drugs, tobacco, alcoholic beverages, graffiti, violence, or those that are sexually suggestive are not acceptable.
6. Any attire that may provoke others to acts of violence is not permitted.
7. Anything resembling gang\* attire is prohibited. This includes but is not limited to any apparel, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, accessory, manner of grooming, and graffiti written on notebooks, backpacks, etc.
8. Pants must be appropriate for correct waist size of student.
9. No military style belts with initials are allowed.
10. Knee length shorts are not to be worn with knee length socks.
11. No dramatically oversized button-down long-sleeved shirts, oversized white T-shirts or other shirts modified with creases or pleats on the front or back are allowed.
12. No pajamas or slippers to be worn.

\*Due to the fact that gang attire changes, the administration in consultation with the School Resource Officer will determine definitions of what is gang-related.

If a student violates these standards, on the first offense the student will be asked to take whatever steps are necessary to meet the expected guidelines. This may involve sending the student home to change the clothing. Parents will be notified if deemed necessary. Repeated violations of the dress code will result in additional disciplinary action, which may include suspension from school for willful defiance.

### STUDENT BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

Students are responsible for their own behavior and are expected to follow all campus rules and regulations. *These behavior expectations apply on campus and at all school activities, on the way to and from school or school activities, and at lunch and break, whether on or off the campus.*

**All students are expected to:**

- Treat all students and staff members with dignity and respect.
- Report any threats or harassment to a campus supervisor, teacher, counselor, or administrator immediately.
- Avoid any physical violence and walk away from any situation that may lead to a physical altercation. "Self-defense" is not an acceptable reason for engaging in physical violence.
- Follow the directions of any Sonora High School employee.
- Obtain teacher permission and an official hall pass prior to leaving class during the period.
- Carry a Sonora High School identification card at all times and present it to school personnel upon request.

**Failure to follow these expectations will result in disciplinary action.**

- Vulgar, obscene, or profane language, writing, or behavior.
- Throwing of any object, including water, ice, food, or beverages.
- Possession of a marking pen with a tip greater than 1/16th of an inch.
- Possession of a laser pointer.
- Any type of horseplay.
- Riding bicycles, skateboards or roller blades on campus.
- All materials or publications, which incite students as to create a clear and present danger.
- The commission of unlawful acts on school premises, violations of lawful school regulations, violations of federal, state, or local law, or the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the school.

### ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones are not to be ON during class time (they are to be **OFF**, not simply on silent or vibrate). If a phone is out or it rings during class, the teacher will take the phone from the student and turn it in to the office.

- First offense** - parents will be called and phone will be returned to student
- Second offense** - parents will be called, student will be assigned Saturday School and parent will need to pick-up phone.
- Third offense** - parents and student will need to meet with an administrator.

CD players and Ipods are allowed in school but cannot be used or be out during class unless approved by the teacher. Consequences same as cell phones.

**The school assumes no responsibility for loss, damage, or theft of electronic devices that have been brought to school or confiscated in violation of the above rule.**

### CODE OF CONDUCT AT SPORTING EVENTS

Students' behavior and conduct at athletic events reflect directly upon their schools. Therefore, administrators, teachers, and coaches will expect appropriate sportsmanship and emphasize things that students and other spectators should, and should not, do at games.

- Know and demonstrate the fundamentals of sportsmanship. Greet visiting teams, bands, and pep units with friendly applause.
- Respect the property of the school and the authority of school officials.
- Show respect for an injured player when he/she is removed from a game.
- Refrain from applauding mistakes by opponents or penalties called against them. The approach should be positive. Students should encourage their team by cheering for them. They should not "boo" or make disparaging remarks about the other team or officials.
- Respect the judgement and strategy of the coach and officials and the efforts made by the players.
- Avoid the use of profane language and refrain from what can generally be called "obnoxious behavior."
- Do not criticize players, coaches, or officials after the game.

### STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

1. **Bicycles:** Bicycles may be ridden to and from school and must be locked in the designated bike rack.
2. **Skateboards:** Skateboards may be ridden to and from school and must be locked in the designated skateboard rack.

### Dances

Students seeking permission to bring a guest who does not attend Sonora High School to a dance must have completed a dance guest pass request. Guest passes will be required for **ALL** dances. The age limit is 20. Students can get a guest pass from the front office or Sonora's Web Site. All students and guests must present a current valid picture ID with date of birth, when buying tickets and upon entering the dance. Students bringing a guest must purchase their tickets at least one day prior to the event.

### I.D. CARDS

Each student will be issued an I.D. card at orientation in August. **Students must carry their I.D. card at all times when on campus or at school events.** Students will not be allowed to purchase ASB stickers, yearbooks, parking permits, dance tickets, or to check out books from the library or the textbook room without their I.D. card. Lost or stolen cards may be replaced at break or lunch at the Activities window. New students may also come to the Activities window at break or lunch to have an I.D. card made up. Lost I.D. cards may be replaced for a fee of \$5.00

### FINES

In order for the school to run efficiently, it is important for us to collect fines on a regular basis. If you have any ASB fines, sports fines, or textbook fines you will need to pay these in a timely manner. You can check on whether or not you have fines by inquiring at the textbook room.

**Textbook Lockers:** If you have any fines, you will not be allowed to register for a locker.  
**School Events:** If you have fines, you will not be allowed to purchase tickets for school events, including Homecoming, Winter Formal and Prom.  
**Yearbooks:** If you have any fines, you will not be allowed to pick up your yearbook until your fines have been paid.

### ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Prompt and daily attendance at school has a direct bearing on academic success. Students are expected to attend all classes for which they are registered every day that classes are in session. Parents are expected to ensure that students attend school and are on time to school each day. The Dean of Attendance is available for consultation regarding attendance and/or adjustment problems.

**For all absences,** parents/guardians are to call the 24-hour attendance line (562) 266-2047 each day of their student's absence, **OR** the student may bring a note to the attendance office from his/her parent/guardian giving the reason and the specific dates of absence upon returning to school. For all other absences, parents/guardians are to call the attendance office (562) 266-2012. By Board Policy, **a student will fail to earn one unit of credit for each three truancies in a class.**

#### IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

- Absences which have not been cleared within three (3) days = **Truancy**
- Three (3) unexcused absences = **One Lost Unit of Credit**  
(as per FJUHSD School Board Policy)
- Tardies beyond thirty (30) minutes = **Absence**
- Leaving campus without an Off Campus Transfer Slip = **Truancy**  
(Check in and check out with the Attendance Office. No exceptions.)

#### The California Department of Education's List of allowable excuses for absences/tardies:

- Illness
- Quarantine
- Medical, dental, optometric, chiropractic appointments
- Funeral services
- Jury duty
- Court appearance
- Religious holiday or ceremony
- Religious retreat (4 hours per semester)
- When the student is the custodial parent of a child who has a medical appointment during school hours
- Justifiable reasons approved by an administrator

#### All other absences and tardies to school are unexcused.

Teachers are not expected to give makeup assignments except in the case of **excused** absences. Upon returning to school, a student will be allowed ONE DAY to make up work missed for each day absent unless time is extended by the teacher.

**Off-Campus Transfers** - Any student who must leave campus before the end of the school day must first get a transfer from the attendance office. A student leaving campus and failing to obtain a transfer will be given a truancy for each period missed. If a student is returning to school the same day, he or she must check in with the attendance office before returning to class.

Any student absent from class due to truancy will be given an "F" for work completed in classes that day; the "F" will be computed in the grade average for the class. Work missed because of truancy may not be made up for credit.

The school will attempt to notify parents/guardians in cases of unexcused absences. However,

parents/guardians are urged to take the initiative in monitoring attendance by calling the school to obtain attendance information.

## PUNCTUALITY

All students are expected to be in their scheduled class each period by the time the tardy bell rings. No students are to be in the hallways after the tardy bell rings, including those who have athletics sixth period or who have an open period at any time during the day. **Students are also not to be sent on errands without an appropriate pass from the teacher.** Students without passes will be sent back to class.

### Consequences for Periods 0 - 6 Tardies

- 1st Tardy Teacher records tardy, student is warned.
- 2nd Tardy Teacher records tardy, parent is contacted by phone or mail.
- 3rd Tardy One hour detention is assigned by the teacher.
- 4th Tardy One hour detention is assigned by the teacher.
- 5th Tardy Teacher refers student to possible Saturday School, In School Suspension, or multiple detentions are assigned. Parent contact by phone or mail.
- 6th Tardy Parent conference held and the student is put on an attendance contract.
- 7th Tardy Possible out of school suspension for defiance, possible schedule adjustment, or other action.

## SATURDAY SCHOOL

Students may be assigned Saturday school by administrators for failure to attend detention, truancy, excessive tardiness, various disciplinary problems and infractions of school rules, or in lieu of one days' suspension. The Saturday sessions are intended to be a structured program of supervised study time. Therefore, students who are assigned are expected to come prepared with school work to do. Classes will be held from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. If you have any questions about this program, please contact our Dean of Attendance. Students who attend may not bring radios, CD or cassette players, have food or drink in the room during study periods, or bring visitors into the classroom.

Students who are disruptive for any reason in the opinion of the Saturday School supervisor will be removed and referred back to the administrator who assigned the Saturday School, as will students who fail to attend when assigned. ***Failure to attend may result in suspension from school.***

## IN-SCHOOL SUSPENSION

Sonora High School offers an In-School Suspension Program as a disciplinary consequence. At the discretion of the school administrator, a student may be assigned In-School Suspension in lieu of suspension out-of-school. Students assigned In-School-Suspension are expected to report to the In-School Suspension Room after 5<sup>th</sup> period on the assigned day and remain there until 3:30 p.m. While there, students are expected to complete schoolwork and to study. Failure to attend or failure to follow any of the rules will result in suspension out-of-school.

## ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

The Fullerton Joint Union High School District has banned the following:

- Any kind of gun (real or fake)
- Any kind of knife (real or fake)
- Any kind of explosive (real or fake)
- Any kind of drug (real or fake)
- Any kind of tagging
- Sexual harassment

Fullerton Joint Union High School District schools adhere to a policy of zero tolerance. Students in violation of this policy are subject to expulsion. Parents and students are encouraged to report safety concerns to the District's **Keep Our Schools Safe Hotline** by calling 1-800-924-SAFE.

## REASONS FOR SUSPENSION

The Education Code includes the following reasons for suspension:

- Infliction of, attempted, or threatened physical injury to another person (EC48900a)
- Possession or sale of any firearm, weapon, knife, explosive or other dangerous objects (EC 48900b)
- Possession, use, sale, or furnishing of any controlled substance, drugs, alcoholic beverages or intoxicants (EC 48900c)
- Offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell an alcoholic beverage, intoxicant, or controlled substance, and sale, delivery, or furnishing of a liquid, substance, or material represented as any controlled substance, alcoholic beverage, intoxicant of any kind (EC48900d).
- Committed or attempted robbery or extortion (EC48900e).
- Caused or attempted to cause damage to school or private property (EC48900f).
- Stole or attempted to steal school or private property (EC48900g).
- Possessed or used tobacco (EC48900h).
- Habitual profanity, obscene acts, vulgarity (EC48900i)
- Possessed, offered, arranged, or negotiated to sell any drug paraphernalia (EC48900j).
- Disruption of school activities or willful defiance (EC48900k).
- Possessed an imitation firearm.
- Knowingly received stolen school property or private property (EC48900.1).
- Engaged in sexual harassment (EC48900.2).
- Engaged in hate violence (EC48900.3).
- Intentional harassment, threats, or intimidation (EC48900.4).

Note: Teachers are not required to provide assignments for suspended students (EC48913).

## ACADEMIC HONESTY

### **Purpose and Definitions**

Sonorra High School students are expected to attend school ready to learn. It is also expected that student behavior will reflect the ability to discern right from wrong. The well being of the school community depends on each student accepting responsibility for personal conduct in both social and academic endeavors.

Academic honesty requires that students take responsibility for producing work that is reflective of the student's best effort. Academic dishonesty is evidenced by cheating or plagiarism and involves any attempt by a student to show possession of knowledge and skills he/she does not possess. For purposes of this policy the following definitions are in effect:

### **Cheating is:**

- Using dishonest, deceptive, or fraudulent means to obtain or attempt to obtain credit for academic work;
- Using notes, aides, or the help of another student on tests in ways other than those expressly permitted by the teacher.
- Looking at another student's tests or answers;
- Talking to another student during a test or quiz;
- Copying or allowing another student to copy from one's own test and other course work;
- Tampering with an instructor's record of student grades/scores;
- Unauthorized accessing, deleting, modifying, transferring or using any analog or digital files/software/programs locally or by remote access.

### **Plagiarism is:**

- Taking the specific substance of another person's work and creating or offering it as one's own work without giving credit to that source;
- Not using quotation marks, indentation, and/or footnotes to denote material that has been directly quoted from another source;
- Paraphrasing an author without giving credit.

## Consequences

A teacher may choose to handle the academic honesty infraction or refer it in written form to the Assistant Principal. If referred, the infraction becomes the "first offense" and a part of the student's permanent disciplinary record. A copy of the referral will be placed in the cumulative file.

**First Offense**

The consequences for a student's first time involvement in an act of academic dishonesty WILL include items L-4 and may include items 5-8 upon administrative review.

1. The student will receive an automatic "zero" (failing grade) on the assignment or test.
2. The teacher will contact the student's parent(s).
3. If the student is involved in an act of academic dishonesty in the class where he/she is a student aide, the student will be dropped from the class with no credit.
4. The student will serve a mandatory four-hour Saturday School.
5. A "U" in citizenship will be recorded on the semester grade report.
6. If the student is a member, the student will be dropped from the National Honor Society (NHS).
7. If the student is a member, the student will be dropped from the California Scholarship Federation (CSF).
8. Possible restriction from participation in school activities.

**Second Offense**

A second offense is one that is committed in the same class during the same school year. The consequences for a student's second time involvement in the same class include the following and any of items 5-8 mentioned above.

1. The student will be referred to the Assistant Principal.
2. The student will be removed from the course with a grade of "F" and no credits.
3. The teacher will contact the student's parent(s).
4. The student will receive a "U" in citizenship.

Once a student violates the academic honesty policy and has received first offense consequences, the next offense in a different class will result in a three-day suspension and a parent conference. A third offense in a different class results in a drop "F" with no credit gained in that specific class and any or all of the consequences listed above.

**Note:** Offenses accumulate for the current semester and the semester following the violation.

**CAREER CENTER**

The Career Center houses information on jobs, work permits, careers. College, SAT and ACT tests, the Regional Occupational Program (ROP), scholarships, financial aid, military ROTC, academics, apprenticeships and vocational/ technical schools.

All students will participate in career units at all grade levels, but students are encouraged to use the many resources in the Career Center on their own. The Career Center is open before school, at break, lunch, and after school to accommodate students. Please stop by room 631, just across the Commons from the Attendance windows, or call (562) 266-2046, or 266-2029.

### ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY (ASB)

Sonora High School has a very active ASB cabinet consisting of student body officers representing the full spectrum of Sonora's student community. All students are encouraged to become involved in ASB sponsored activities or to run for one of the ASB offices. Copies of the ASB Constitution are available in the Activities Office.

#### Eligibility Rules for ASB Candidates

1. All candidates must have a 2.25 GPA with no more than one "D" and no "F's" in the previous semester grading period. No more than one "N" and no "U's" are allowed. This standard must be maintained all year for the student to remain in office.
2. All candidates must turn in an election contract signed by themselves and their parents by the deadline.
3. All candidates must attend the mandatory meeting indicated in the election calendar. (Issued with the candidate election packet available in the Activities Office).
4. All candidates and at least ONE PARENT/GUARDIAN must attend a mandatory Parent/Student meeting.
5. All candidates must be able to enroll in the Leadership class.
6. Candidates may not run for office if they have outstanding fines.

### CONFERENCES WITH TEACHERS

Parents are encouraged to confer with their student's teachers regarding student progress in class. When parents want to talk to a teacher, either by phone or in person, they may contact the school to make appropriate arrangements. Most concerns can be handled successfully by telephone. Personal conferences are welcome, however, if the telephone conversation proves inadequate.

### DAILY BULLETIN

The Daily Bulletin is read each morning at the beginning of Period 3. Announcements must be turned in to the Activities Office by noon on the day before the announcement is to be read. Announcements must be legible and suitable for reading on the Daily Bulletin. Clubs and organizations are permitted two announcements per week for any one activity. The Daily Bulletin is found under announcements in Sonora's Web page. Parents may receive the Daily Bulletin via e-

mail by signing up at Sonora's web page.

## HEALTH SERVICE

On-site health services are limited to first aid procedures. The Attendance Office is the place to report for injuries or when ill. Parents will be contacted and/or emergency services called as warranted. State mandated hearing and vision tests will be arranged for ninth grade students. A District special health needs team organizes and disseminates information as appropriate.

## TEXTBOOK PROCEDURE

The school provides all textbooks used by Sonora students. Students are expected to handle books with care. Students are expected to cover all textbooks. Students should write their names in ink on the first blank line of the space provided inside the front cover of their books. They should also complete a textbook card or have the book "scanned" for each book used, noting on the back of the card any damage to the book. Textbooks are to be returned in good condition at the end of the year. Fines will be issued for loss of or damage to textbooks. Fines will result in withholding of grades, not being able to participate in school events such as dances, and/or final transcript and diploma.

## LIBRARY

The goal of the Sonora High School Library staff is to enhance student learning, foster a love of reading, and work with teachers to produce information-literate students who are well-prepared for the rigors of research at the post-secondary level.

In support of this goal

- ❖ The library will be open daily from 7:15 to 3:45. Faculty tutoring during evening hours may be announced.
- ❖ Freshman students will attend a Library Orientation during which they will learn more about library services and resources and how to use them.
- ❖ Students may also come to the library for further information on library services and resources.
- ❖ Overdue notice will be sent periodically to 3<sup>rd</sup> period teachers for distribution. Fines will be charged at a rate of \$.10 per school day per book.
- ❖ Students are responsible for lost or damaged books and will be charged replacement costs as well as a processing fee.

## WAIVERS FOR SCHOOL TRIPS

Students making any type of trip sponsored by the school are required to obtain waivers signed by the parent. The necessary waiver forms are supplied by the particular advisor involved. One general waiver obtained early in the school year is sufficient for all trips.

## LOCKERS

Textbook lockers and gym lockers are made available for student use while in school. Students are responsible for providing their own locks. All lockers must be registered and if students share a locker, both students should register for that locker. **As lockers are not totally safe from break-in or vandalism, it is recommended that valuables not be left in them at any time.** Personal belongings, school books, equipment, and materials checked out to the students are the responsibility of the student. School personnel will take every reasonable action possible to protect student property, **but neither Sonora High School nor the Fullerton Joint Union High School District is responsible for losses occurring from these lockers or any other location on campus, whether during the school day or after school hours.** As a matter of security and health safety concerns, any student issued a locker is advised that the school reserves the right to conduct random searches of locker contents throughout the school year. Lockers will not be issued to students with outstanding fines. **Locks put on unregistered lockers will be cut off without notification or warning.**

## TELEPHONES

Pay telephones are located in the lower commons and at the entrance to the gymnasium. These telephones are not to be used during class time. School office telephones are not to be used by students unless by special permission. To ensure as few interruptions to the instructional program as possible, telephone messages are not delivered to students.

## TRANSPORTATION

The FUHSD maintains buses, inspected regularly by the California Highway Patrol, for the transportation of students living in distant parts of the Sonora attendance area. Each student is required to obtain a bus pass from the driver of his/her bus. Transportation by school bus is a privilege extended to the students of this school and may be denied to a student whose conduct is in violation of existing rules and regulations. Parents of pupils will be held financially responsible for willful destruction or defacing of a school bus or its equipment. Students attending Sonora High School on an inter-district or intra-district transfer are responsible for their own transportation. The district does not provide transportation to students who live outside the Sonora attendance area.

## WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE

Any student who is transferring out of the school needs to complete the withdrawal procedure. **The student needs to bring a written note from the parent expressing the intent to withdraw to the Registrar in the Guidance Office.** Then the check-out form will be prepared for the student to carry to each teacher, to the library, and to the textbook clerk for clearance. All books or other school property need to be returned or paid for at that time.

## HOMEWORK

Homework assignments are an important supplement to classroom instruction and contribute significantly to the achievement of the goals and objectives of every class. Time set aside for homework allows for critical review of concepts, for reflection about new ideas generated by classroom discussions, for practice and review of skills introduced during the class period, and/or the development of self-discipline, self-reliance, and effective time management skills. Homework assignments need not always be written; they may take many forms depending upon the type of class and the teacher's objectives. If students are expected by teachers and by parents to complete assigned homework, then higher levels of learning can take place. Parents are urged to take an active part in the education of their students by periodically asking about school homework. Generally, students will have homework at least four nights a week in most courses.
